## HIGHLIGHTS AND ATTRACTIONS

A mani Nature Reserve and its surrounding area has much to offer the visitor. The trails and driving routes crisscrossing the area have been designed in a way that everyone's diverse and varied interests and needs are met while maintaining the natural integrity of the area. In fact, many of the trails and driving routes are designed in a way to encompass the widest range of natural and cultural environments East Usambara has to offer. In order to facilitate visitor enjoyment of the area, this **trail key** briefly describes each of Amani's trails and driving routes: the major features, sights and interests found on each of them. The list is by no means exhaustive. Even those closely familiar with the area are constantly surprised by the biodiversity and richness of the area.


A selected group of local villagers have been trained as nature guides by Amani Nature Reserve. These knowledgeable guides can further tailor routes to quest's specific demands - whether it be botany, birding, hiking, ecology or just the leisurely enjoyment of nature. In fact, the information provided by the trail guides is limited only to generic information about the various trails. In order to gain a deeper knowledge and enjoyment of the culture and nature of Amani, a guide is recommended on all the trails.

### **HOW TO FIND AMANI?**

Amani Nature Reserve is located west of the coastal city of Tanga. The town of Muheza, situated at the foothills of the East Usambara mountains, is 35 kilometers from Tanga. Signposts guide the traveller the remaining 25 kilometers from Muheza to Amani.
